DIRECTIONS

FROM POINTS NORTH:

Travel Route 83 South through Somers Center, turn right onto Field Road and straight onto Egypt Road. Fairgrounds will be on your right-hand side.

FROM PONTS SOUTH:

Travel Route 83 North turning left onto Billings Road and left onto Egypt Rd. Fairgrounds will be on your right-hand side.

FROM I-91 and POINTS WEST:

Traveling I-91, North or South, take exit 47E for Route 190, into Somers Center. Turn right onto Route 83. Then turn right onto Field Road and straight onto Egypt Rd. Fairgrounds will be on your right-hand side.

FROM POINTS EAST:

Travel Route 190 West into Somers Center and turn left onto Route 83. Then turn right onto Field Road and straight onto Egypt Road. Fairgrounds will be on your right-hand side

Open Horse Show Rules & Regulations

1. The Four Town Fair and show committee will not be held responsible for any accident to exhibitors, horses, property or any spectator on the grounds. Nor will anyone connected with this show be responsible for any such accident/damage.

- 2. The judges will start promptly at 8:00 AM. Sign-in 7am-8am.
- 3. The show committee reserves the right to cancel, divide or combine any classes.
- 4. All entrants must be suitably attired.
- Martingales are not permitted in English flat classes. Mechanical hackamores, tiedowns, and/or running martingales are not permitted in Western classes.
 - and/ of fullning martingales are not permitted in western elasses.
- 6. Horses are not allowed in the Midway area of the fair; anyone disobeying this rule will be disqualified for the remainder of the show and entry fees will be forfeited.

7. Vehicles pulling horse trailers may enter fairgrounds free of charge. All other vehicles will be charged a 10.00 fee at the gate

8. Red ribbons must be in the tails of kickers; this is mandatory. Disorderly conduct on the part of either the horse or rider may be cause for disqualification from the class.

9. (8) ribbons will be awarded in each class. Day End & High point award based on a team of the same horse/pony and rider.

10. Chaps permitted in Equitation Classes.

11. Jr. Rider-18 years of age and under, Adult Rider-19 years of age and over. Leadline Rider- 8 years of age and under

12. Walk/Trot open to exhibitors who have not shown in any class requiring them to canter. Not eligible to show outside of their division

13. Green Horse-open to any horse or pony in its first or second year of showing.

14.Touch-N-Out consists of one vertical jump in the center of the ring. Starting as a ground pole and increasing by 3" increments each round. All exhibitors having a clean round (horse may not touch the pole at all) advance to the next round. The height will continue to increase as long as there are exhibitors with clean rounds. Jump may be trotted or cantered.

15. Local Pleasure is only for the residents of the four towns-Somers, Ellington, Enfield, and East Windsor.

16. All rules and regulations of the show will be strictly enforced in accordance with the 2022 USEF Rule book. Complaints MUST BE directed to the Show office. No person shall approach the judge with regard to a decision of any matter unless permission is obtained from the Show Office. The decision of the judge throughout the competition will be final.

***Numbers will not be issued without proof of a current negative COGGINS as well as proof of RABIES vaccination and open check or payment**

17. .NO dogs are allowed on the fairgrounds.

GYMKHANA CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

POLE BENDING - A timed event where rider and horse weave in and out of a line of poles while racing to complete the pattern as quickly and accurately as possible without knocking any poles down. The pattern may be run to the left or the right.

<u>KEYHOLE RACE</u> - A timed event where the rider and horse race down to the end of the arena, spin around in the keyhole and race back to the finish line.

 $\underline{FLAG \ RACE} \ - \ \Lambda \ timed \ event \ where 3 \ barrels \ are \ set \ in \ the \ cloverleaf \ pattern. \ The \ rider \ and \ horse \ cross \ the \ start \ line \ and \ pick \ up \ a \ flag \ off \ of \ the \ first \ barrel, \ proceed \ around \ the \ second \ barrel, \ and \ drop \ the \ flag \ in \ a \ container \ on \ the \ third \ barrel, \ then \ cross \ the \ finish \ line.$

BARREL RACE - A timed event where the rider and horse maneuver around 3 barrels set in a triangular pattern at the center of the arena. The pattern can be ridden left or right, the rider will make a tight turn around the first barrel an then race to the second barrel and turn in the opposite direction. Riders then race on to the third barrel and turn in the opposite direction and then race home and across the finish line.

SALLY WHEELER TOUCH N' OUT CLASS - We start with a ground pole and after everyone goes over, we raise the rail a hole at a time. If your horse touches the rail, you're out. The last horse to jump clean wins.

WESTERN CLASSES—Each section will feature a Junior, and Open, and an Open Stake section. Junior classes are open to anyone who has not reached their 18th birth year. Open classes are open to all horse and rider combinations. The Open Stake classes are open to all horse and rider combinations and will feature a percentage on entry payback and ribbons to 8th place.

There will be day end High Point Junior and High Point Open Rider awards calculated by point accumulated in each of those sections of the western classes.

The Ranch Horse division will not be factored in to the end of the day points. This division will have a Champion and Reserve Champion like the rest of the flat classes of the day.

<u>HALTER</u>- Horse will be judged in resemblance to their breed with the focus being a combination of balance, structural correctness, muscling, and movement.

SHOWMANSHIP- Horses will be judged on the grooming and fitting of the horse and the expertise of the handler to present the horse to the best of their ability. To be judged on a pattern consisting of maneuvers such as walking, trotting, pivoting, backing, and setting up.
